## DON'T FORGET TO BRING YOUR ID TO VOTE!

Voter ID is now required for UK elections. You will not be able to vote at the polling station on 4th July without certain forms of voter ID, eg: passport, drivers licence, older person's bus pass or if you have a Voter Authority Certificate (for which the application deadline is Wednesday 24 April). Remember you don't need Voter ID if you have a postal vote.
